
2018 ANNUAL REPORT





OUR Scouting Story...

Buffalo Trace Council is dedicated to the youth of our community, serving 4,921 Scouts and Explorers within its boundaries - in the Indiana counties of Dubois, Gibson, Knox, Perry, Pike, Posey, Spencer, Vanderburgh, and Warrick; and the Illinois counties of Edwards, Gallatin, Lawrence, Richland, Wabash, and White.

Buffalo Trace Council collaborates with 130 community organizations, or Chartered Partners, to provide Scouting programs to the youth in our neighborhoods.

The Council provides direct program service to support its 156 units – Cub Scout Packs, Boy Scout Troops, Venturing Crews, and Explorer Posts.

Buffalo Trace Council also continues to grow its Scoutreach and Exceptional Needs Scouting programs by expanding into counties outside of Vanderburgh.

In addition to its programs, Buffalo Trace Council maintains a Council camp, Old Ben Scout Reservation, near Winslow, IN, and camps more than 1,400 Scouts annually on its 270 acre wilderness preserve.

Nearly 6,000 Scouts, leaders, and community partners participated in an event or activity at the Eykamp Scout Center.

Our Scouts and their leaders provided more than 20,000 community service hours in 2018.

Scouting Adventures

Lion Scouts—A fun introduction to the Scouting program for kindergarten-age youth eager to get going! Lions do adventures with their adult partners and other Lions every month. This program introduces youth and their families to Scouting and the outdoors as it builds a foundation of character. A Lion den is part of the Cub Scout pack.



Tiger Scouts—One-year, family-oriented program for a group of teams, each consisting of a first-grade (or 7-year-old) boy or girl and an adult partner (usually a parent). A Tiger den is part of the Cub Scout pack.

Cub Scouting—Family- and community-centered approach to learning citizenship, compassion, and courage through service projects, ceremonies, games, and other activities promoting character development and physical fitness.



Boy Scouting—With the Scout Oath and Scout Law as guides, and the support of parents and religious and neighborhood organizations, Scouts develop an awareness and appreciation of their role in their community and become well-rounded young men through the advancement of the program. Scouts progress in rank through achievements, gain additional knowledge and responsibilities, and earn merit badges that introduce a lifelong hobby or a rewarding career.



Venturing—Provides experiences to help young men and women, ages 14—or 13 with completion of the eighth grade—through 20, become mature, responsible, caring adults. Young people learn leadership skills and participate in challenging outdoor activities, including having access to Boy Scout camping properties, a recognition program, and Youth Protection training.



Exploring—Exists to teach important life and career skills to young people through career experiences and mentorship provided by community and business leaders. We equip young people with character, leadership and life skills that can be used both today and in their future.

Family Scouting starting in 2018, families could choose to sign up their sons and daughters, who are ages 5-10, for Cub Scouts. Chartered organizations could choose to establish a new girl pack, establish a pack that consists of girl dens and boy dens or remain an all-boy pack. Cub Scout dens are single gender — all boys or all girls. Using the same curriculum as the Boy Scouting program, Scouts BSA is scheduled to launch in February 2019, enabling all eligible youth ages 11-17, to earn the Eagle Scout rank. Scouts BSA will be single gender — all-girl troops or all-boy troops. This unique approach allows the organization to maintain the integrity of the single-gender model while also meeting the needs of today's families.

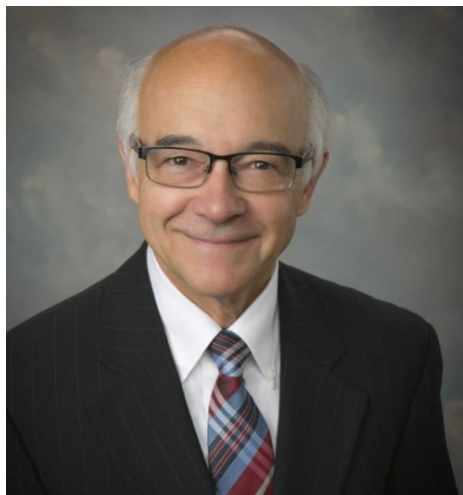

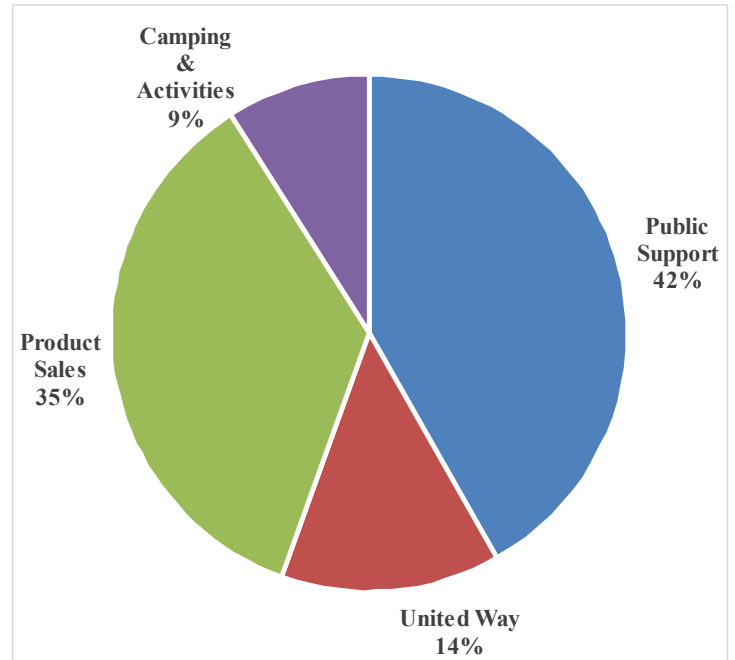

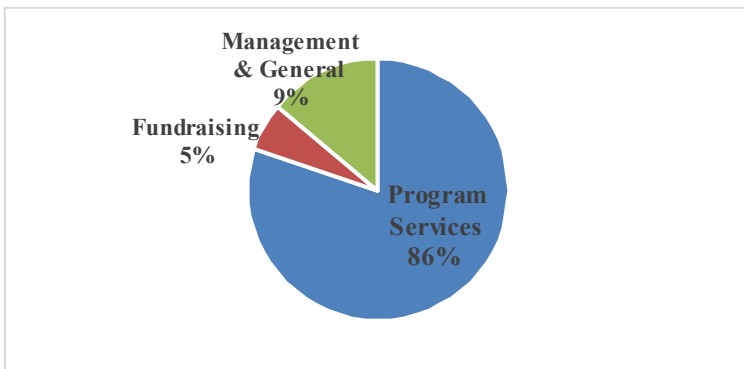
